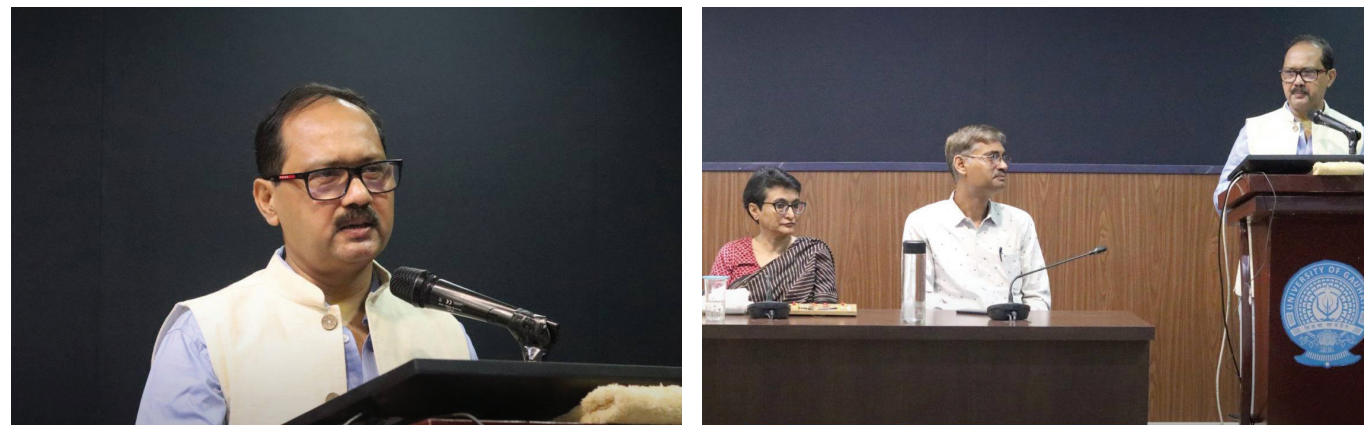
THE VIKSIT BHARAT YOUTH PARLIAMENT 2025

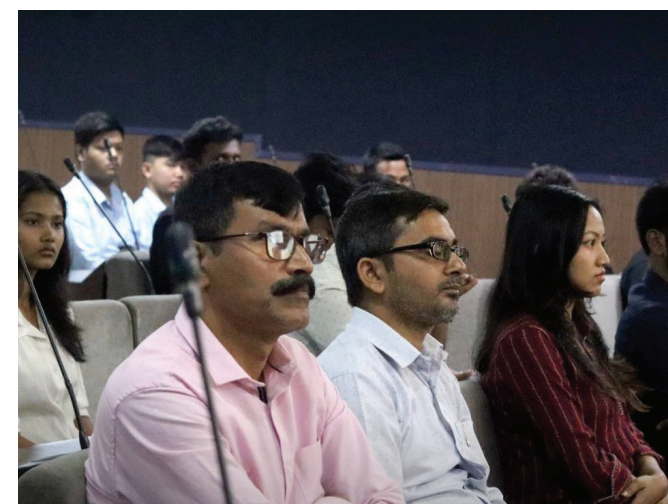
JAPANESE TEAM VISIT TO GAUHATI UNIVERSITY'S BOTANICAL GARDEN

Before I Fall Silent – Prof. G.N. Devy's final public lecture at Gauhati University on 20 March, 2025

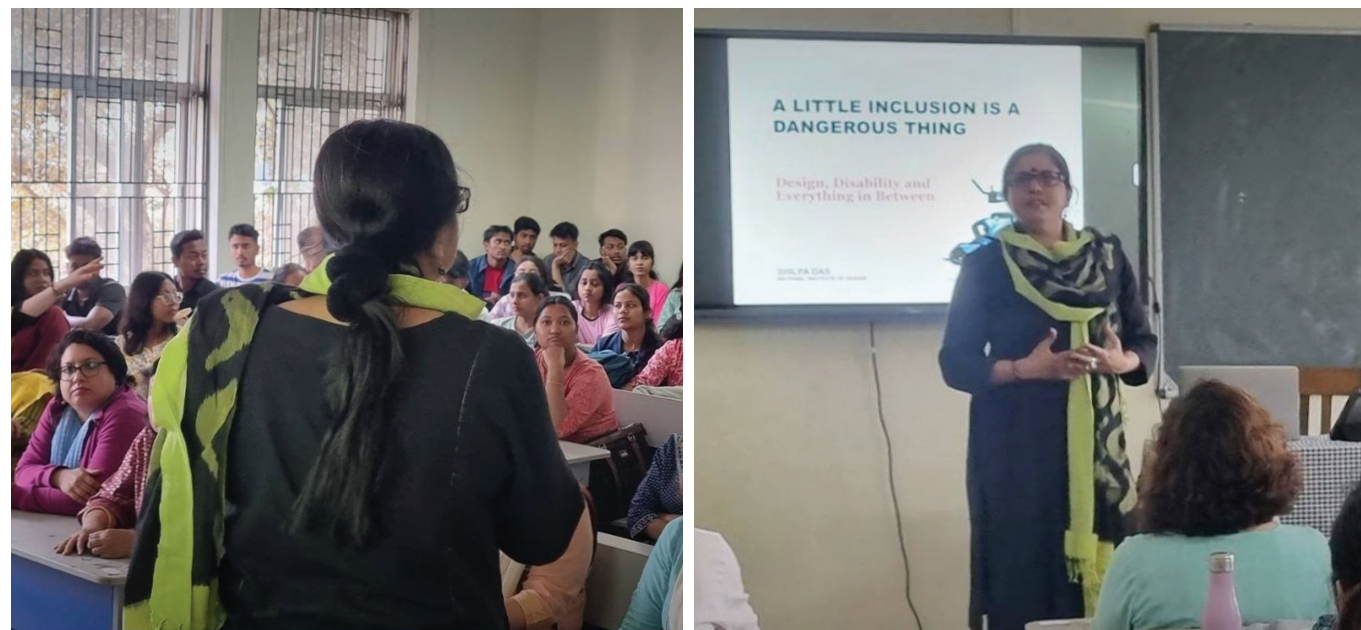
"Before I fall silent..." With these words, Prof. G.N. Devy closed a five-decade journey of public lectures, choosing Gauhati University as his final stage.

MoU WITH TERI, ICIMOD AND BALIPARA FOUNDATION

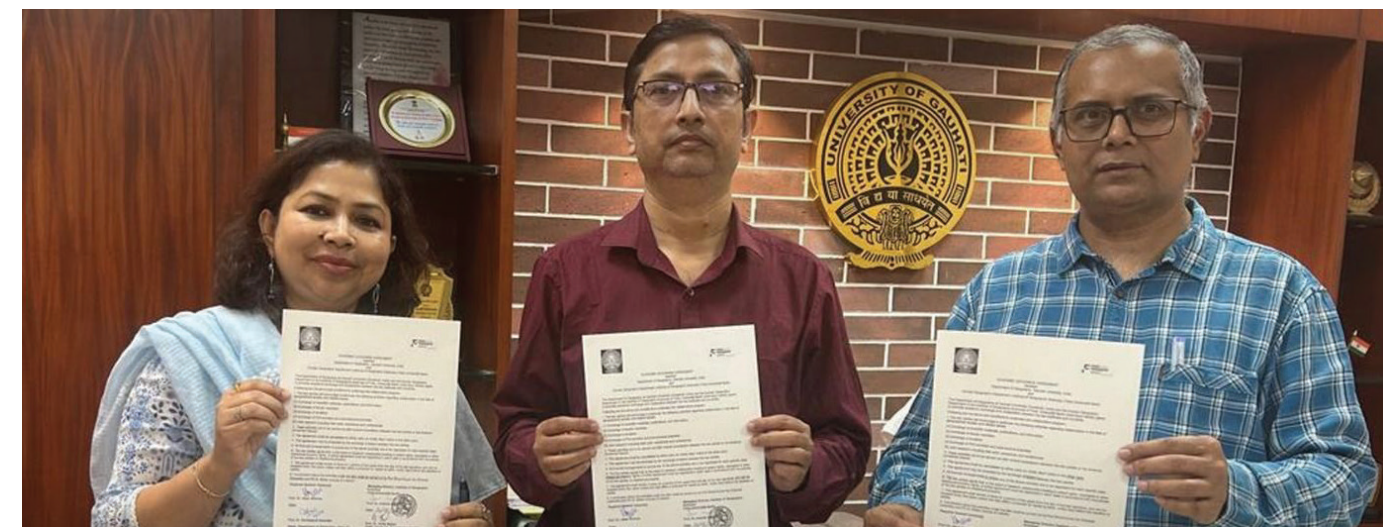
Sustainability isn't a choice—it's our responsibility!

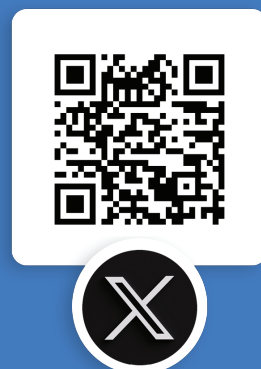
